CHAPTER BUSINESS MEETING

On Wednesday, May 15, the Board of Directors will hold a Chapter Business Meeting at 10:00am to vote on proposed amendments to the MS Chapter Bylaws.

At its Mid-Year Meeting in March, the International Board approved moving forward with restructuring SWANA's governance in an effort that would increase the number of SWANA regions to 13 from 5 and give each region a seat on a new, smaller Board of Directors. The new structure is intended to:

- provide Chapters and Regions with increased representation on a new Board of Directors
- strengthen communications with more focus on the relationship between the international organization, regions, and Chapters
- continue to involve all the Chapters and other specialty member groups in the international organization through the establishment of an Advisory Board which will participate in three standing committees (Finance, Policy and Planning/Membership)
- establish more opportunities for development of future leadership positions in the organization through establishment of Regional Director Deputies, Committee Chairs, Vice Committee Chair assignments and the Advisory Board.
