




THE STATE OF RECYCLING IN MISSISSIPPI



HOW ARE WE DOING?


- Counties with recycling programs are in white.
- 50% of residents have access to recycling services-includes curbside and/or drop-off.
- Does not include metal scrap dealers, e-waste recyclers and other outlets for special materials.
- Infrastructure is lacking.

DATA COLLECTION


- Municipal Measurement Program

- Collects Solid Waste and Recycling Data
- Helps Determine Progress toward State Waste Reduction Goal of 25% (Miss. Code Ann. § 49-31-5)
- Aids Local Governments in Tracking Program Growth and Progress, Make Changes as Needed
 - Continuing to Develop Methods for Increasing Data Collection

- Goal to work with Mississippi Development Authority and Others to Encourage Recycling Businesses to Locate in Mississippi
- SWIFR Grant
- Increase Number of Sorting and Bailing Facilities, Processors and End Users


